## NOTICE TO AUTHORS

The Editor welcomes the submission of manuscripts on theoretical and applied statistics.

Manuscripts should be clearly typewritten double spaced with ample spacing on all sides, top and bottom, left and right. Our conventions are: italics are underlined by straight line, bold-faced letters by a wavy line, Greek by a red line, and script letters are encircled in blue. Graphs, figures and diagrams should be drawn expertly in India ink on plain white paper and roughly twice the size they are to appear in print. All formulas should be written in linear form: vertical forms should be avoided, e.g.

$$(a + b) / (c + d) \text{ instead of } \frac{a + b}{c + d}.$$

Subscripts and superscripts should be properly and clearly placed below and above the line, and, if possible, should be written in India ink. All symbols should be automatically italicized.

Footnotes are to be enumerated successively on a separate sheet and should be minimized, or, if at all possible, completely avoided.

References should be given at the end of the article on a separate sheet. The following forms should be followed:
